#### **Seabird Armistice Project**



On 11 November the **Seabird Progress Association** (SPA) hosted a Remembrance Day event as part of its Armistice Centenary Project. The project was funded by the Department of Veterans' Affairs and supported by the Shire of Gingin. It involved the construction of a memorial, consisting of two statues of World War I diggers, and enhancement of the plaza area surrounding it including floodlighting of the memorial.

More than 90 people attended the event, including SPA President Garry Thomas who gave the opening welcome, Shane Love MLA who laid a wreath, Deputy Shire President John Elgin who gave the commemorative address, and Cr Frank Johnson who said the Armistice Prayer and read the poem "In Flanders Fields". Shire President Sam Collard gave the closing address. The ceremony was also attended by the Gingin Police and St John's Ambulance crew from Woodridge. Citizen of the Year Suzy Wright and Senior Constable Cindy Lynch raised the flags, and the "Ode of Remembrance" was recited by Phil Marinich.

A healthy and delicious lunch was then served by Bloss Thomas and Jenny Susac. It was wonderful to see so many of the younger generation in attendance, some of whom engaged in an impromptu cricket match at the conclusion of proceedings.

The SPA thanks everyone who participated, especially Liam Register and Lucio Neves who did the construction work, the Department of Veterans' Affairs for providing the grant that made it possible, and the Hon Christian Porter MP for his support of the project.
