# Gingin Outdoor Activity Space Project – Initial Survey Results

In March 2018 several motivated Gingin community members came together to form a group, termed the 'Gingin Interactive Space Group' (GISG), to support the development of a new outdoor activity space within the Gingin town site. The GISG strongly believes that the development of a new interactive space will foster intergenerational benefits for an active, healthy and safe community.

The GISG conducted engagement with the broader Gingin community around the project. With support from the Shire of Gingin, the GISG organised a survey which consisted of 12 questions and was open to the public from 1-28 February 2019.

The survey received a generous response from 223 individuals who represented a variety of households (predominantly young families) consisting of 465 adults and 350 children in total. Most individual respondents were aged 26-45 years old with however, a surprising 30% of respondents reporting having no children at home.

Most respondents supported a nature based playground but were open to all types and they rated the top three outdoor facility features to include in the space as shade structures, toilet facilities and activity space for children between 5-9 years.

Respondents rated the top three playground equipment features as climbing features, balancing equipment and a place to ride bikes and/or scooters. Respondents also felt that the top two themes should either be nature/bushland or farming and agriculture.

"The GISG would like to thank respondents for their valuable input regarding a vision that we have been working hard to see come to fruition. Overall we are excited to see some incredibly positive feedback about the possibility of a new Outdoor Activity Space within the Gingin town site."

The Shire will continue to work collaboratively with the GISG on this project and to assist with providing updates, etc. in the near future to the community. The Concept Design-Draft for the space is now available for public viewing. If community members have the time, it would be appreciated if they could fill out a short survey for this project or attend one of the consultation sessions which will be held in Gingin over the peet couple of weeks. ### **Swimming Pool & Spa Fence Inspections**

On 23 December 2017 an amendment to Part 8, Division 2 of the *Building Regulations 2012* took effect requiring ALL private swimming pools and spas within the Shire of Gingin to have compliant fencing.

This information was communicated to all Shire of Gingin residents via a media release through the Shire's website and social media channels. The Shire also sent letters out to individual rate payers detailing the changes and what requirements (if any) they would be expected to undertake if they had a swimming pool or spa.



Currently the Shire is conducting its fencing inspections for swimming pools and spas which occurs every four years. The Shire would like to remind residents that if you have either a pool or a spa it must be adequately fenced

even if you live outside of a gazetted town site. Common reasons for non-compliance include pool gates not closing from all positions and climbable objects (pot plants, chairs, etc.) within 1200mm of pool fencing.

#### What will be the focus of the Agenda for the first meeting?

To meet and make decisions on the format of and future meetings in addition to sharing information on upcoming community events.
