Upper Coastal Sporting Facilities – Workshop 1 Summary

The first Upper Coastal Sporting Facilities project workshop was held on Saturday, 30 November 2019 at the Ledge Point Country Club.



This workshop was held to inform the community about the project and associated considerations. Additionally the workshop provided an opportunity to collectively discuss the predicted challenges and opportunities for the project.

More than 70 community members from the Upper Coastal community attended the workshop facilitated by the project consultants. The attendees were able to ask questions and contribute to identifying a range of issues and possible solutions.

The Shire of Gingin thanks the community representatives from the Upper Coastal Sporting Facilities Working Group and Councillors who both assisted with the event's activities along with the Ledge Point Country Club for hosting the event and breakfast feast.

Health Alert for Swimmers

From December 2019 to March 2020 recreational swimmers in the Moore River (and other fresh water bodies, i.e. dams) should be aware of the risk of contracting Naegleria fowleri when swimming.

To date this organism has NEVER been detected in the Moore River. Weekly water sampling is undertaken at Moore River in addition to others sites around the Shire by the Shire of Gingin as part of the Department of Health's state-wide water monitoring program. However, the Thermophilic Naegleria organism has been detected and is considered to be the pre-cursor to possible Naegleria fowleri.

Should Naegleria fowleri be detected then the Department and the Shire will implement immediate procedures to warn the public of the potential dangers that the organism may cause and how to avoid contracting it.

Infection occurs when swimmers inhale any infected water via the nasal passage. This most frequently occurs when swimming, diving or falling into water or when playing with sprinklers or hoses as young children frequently do.

The last reported case of Naegleria fowleri occurred in WA in 1985. That is not cause however, for complacency and all swimmers should take care when swimming in any recreational bodies of water during the summer months. Swimmers should attempt to keep their heads above water and avoid jumping or diving into fresh bodies of warm water or any actions where water is forced through the nose at pressure.
