Rates Mail Out Delay

The Shire has received a number of queries over the past several weeks in relation to the receiving of Rates Notices by Rate Payers.

Firstly we would like to apologise for the confusion and any inconvenience caused. Our investigations have revealed that a sorting error by the printers has caused some Rates Notices at random to be sent to incorrect postal locations.

In addition, Australia Post have advised that since the beginning of the Pandemic, the post is only been delivered every second day due to a fall in letter numbers being posted.

Where To From Here

At this stage if rate payers have still not received your Rates Notices in the post then please let us know - (08) 9575 5126. Your first rate payment for the year (or in full) is due 16 September so if you still haven't received your Rates Notice then the Shire can arrange to send you a copy.

Tip Pass & Parking Permit

If you have not received your Rates Notice by 1 September then Rate Payers can continue using your 2019/20 Parking Permits and Rubbish Tip pass (also contained in your Rates Mail Out). The Shire's Rangers and Landfill Managers have been made aware of this and will accept these if presented to them. It is expected that at some point in September, every ratepayer should have received a copy of their Rates and a date will be announced when the 2020/21 Tip Pass and Parking Permit will need to be presented instead.

Coastal Erosion Funding Success

The Shire is pleased to advise the community that Council has received four grants to address coastal erosion. As such, the Shire has received \$154,576 in grant funding in total.

Two of the grants were awarded under the Coastal Management Plan Assistance Program (CMPAP) from the Department of Planning, Lands and Heritage. The first was for the Revision Lancelin project which was successful in obtaining \$69,865 from a total project cost of \$141,170. The second was for the Coastal Hazard Risk Management & Adaptation Plan (CHRMAP) and Inundation Study Integration which is for \$51,400 from a total project cost of \$106,100.

Council is also waiting to hear if it has been successful in obtaining a further grant from the same program for the Coastal Management Strategy grant which is for \$31,962 from a total project cost of \$66,925.

The other two grants the Shire was successful in being awarded were from the Department of Transport under the Coastal Adaptation & Protection (CAP) grants scheme. These were for the Ledge Point / Guilderton Groynes Assessment grant for \$13,476 from a total project cost of \$26,926 and the Hotspot Coastal Monitoring project for \$19,835 from a total project cost of \$42,735.

Council was advised that it did not receive the Seabird Seawall Assessment grant for \$12,190 from a total project cost of \$24,381.

This is fantastic news for the Shire and will mean that Council can now take some big steps forward in addressing the issue of coastal erosion.

Annual Budget Available Now

The 2020/21 Budget is now available for viewing on the Shire's website. This year the Shire has adopted a 0% rate increase as mentioned in previous articles. The total revenue the Shire collects from Rate Payers remains unchanged from 2019/20.

This year the Shire will be undertaking some big projects including:

- Gingin Colocation Fire Shed \$2,181,500*
- Lancelin Skate Park Bowl (at BMX Track) Stage 2 -
- Gingin Regional Playground \$1,025,890*
- Cunliffe Street Development \$500,000*
- Granville Civic Centre Building repairs, roof & ceiling replacement and LED lighting - \$145,500

*Project is subject to receiving external funding.



Despite the financial strain caused to many of our local businesses by the pandemic, the Shire is delighted to welcome a number of local businesses which have come on board to sponsor the Shire's Early Rates Incentive Scheme. We thank those businesses wholeheartedly for their support this year given the unique circumstances. This scheme really does help us to action community projects sooner rather than

later. Their generous contributions will make up terrific prizes for 10 lucky early ratepayers – some of whom may very much welcome the opportunity to win one of the prizes if they have been doing it tough because of the pandemic. The date for the random prize draw is 18 September with the Prize Night to occur in November.

Farewell to Dr Conradie

It is with regret that the Shire of Gingin Council must inform the community that Dr Danel Conradie has advised the Shire of her resignation from the Gingin Medical Centre.

Dr Conradie commenced with the Gingin Medical Centre team 9.5 years ago and she has been an integral part of the Centre's team during that time. She has conducted herself to a high professional standard and she will be greatly missed by her patients. Dr Conradie's departure is scheduled to occur 30 November 2020.

Council and staff would like to wish Dr Conradie the best in her future endeavours. It was a privilege to enjoy a good working relationship with her during her time in Gingin and her future patients will be fortunate to receive her services.

In the coming months Council will look to employ a new doctor and Council has already commenced liaison with several prospective doctors looking to take on the Gingin Medical Centre practice. Council will endeavour to keep the community informed during this process and will aim to hopefully secure a new doctor for the Centre prior to Dr Conradie's departure.

If you're a rate payer in the Shire of Gingin then you should recently have received (or be about to receive) your Fire Break Orders from the Shire in the post along with a copy of your Recycling Calendar and some fire information flyers.

Please don't throw out your Orders! Your Fire Break Orders contain a list of

requirements that all property owners must enact prior to the 2020/21 bush fire season which commences from 1 October 2020 and continues to 31 May 2021. You are legally obligated to undertake these measures as per the Bushfires Act 1954. Failure to do so can result in the issuing of an infringement. If your copy of the Fire Break Orders fail to arrive within the next 2 weeks then please
