### **Level 2 Business Assistant Packages** announced by State Government

The WA Premier has announced a Level 2 Business Assistance Package for WA businesses to provide assistance for financial hardship caused by the COVID-19 pandemic.

In addition to the Level 1 support package for business, the assistance programs for Level 2 will provide financial hardship payments for small - medium sized business with 50% of greater loss in revenue over the January - April 2022 period. The package also provides support for hospitality businesses and commercial sporting franchises.

## New Water Fountain installed at Wangaree Park

It might have taken a little while to receive the fountain from the supplier (COVID-19 is still continuing to impact all sorts of supply chains both nationally and internationally) but the new water fountain for Wangaree Park has finally been received.

The fountain has now being installed in it's new home in Wangaree Park.

#### **Bookine Road Reseal**

The reseal road works for Bookine Road has now been completed.

Shire staff undertook the reseal over the existing seal along a 2.7km length of Bookine Road and provided a second coat to improve the life expectancy.





#### **Safe use of Commercial Garden Soils**

Cases of Legionnaires' Disease commonly increase during Autumn and Spring as gardeners get back outside and start using packaged potting mixes and bulk soil supplies. This disease can be deadly for the elderly or people with a weakened immune systems.

The Shire promotes the safe use of commercial garden soils and encourages the community to follow health advice in their use, particularly by our elderly residents.
