
Commonwealth of Games Comes to Lancelin

Proposed Heavy Vehicle Movement Ban Indian Ocean Drive / Lancelin Rd Intersection, Shire of Gingin

Main Roads WA in consultation with the Shire of Gingin is proposing to restrict the right turn movement for RAVs (Restricted Access Vehicles) on Indian Ocean Dr into Lancelin Rd. This would prohibited heavy vehicles over 19.0m in length from undertaking the right turn movement. Main Roads will be modifying the pavement marking at this location and the proposed change will improve traffic flow and increase road safety at this intersection. Thinking About Your Firebreaks Yet?

A reminder to owners and/or occupiers of land within the Shire of Gingin that it is time to start thinking about firebreak compliance in preparation for the summer bushfire season. It is a legal requirement under the *Bush Fires Act 1954* to maintain firebreaks from 1 November to 31 May every year.

Your firebreak should be 3 metres wide with a minimum vertical clearance of 4 metres to enable fire vehicles to drive along the firebreaks without access being obstructed. The following tasks may need to be undertaken to make your firebreak compliant:

- Trimming tree branches and bushes
- Removing dead wood and leaves
- Reducing weeds (chemical spraying)
- Raking / discing / grading / scarifying etc.

Changes to Fire Danger Rating System

As of 1 September 2022, the new Australian Fire Danger Rating System (AFDRS) will go live. This new system is being rolled out nationally and will be the standard FDR for all States. DFES has secured Commonwealth funding to assist local governments with signage replacement, and over the

coming months the Shire will be working with DFES to update our roadside FDR signs to bring them in line with the new standard.



NEW AFDRS FRAMEWORK

Category	Fire behaviour index (FBI) range	High Level Messaging
No rating	0-11	No action required.
Moderate	12-23	Plan and prepare.
High	24-49	Be ready to act.
Extreme	50-99	Take action now to protect life and property.
Catastrophic	100+	For your survival, leave bushfire risk areas.
