Cowalla Road Upgrade Completed

Over two kilometres of Cowalla Road between Cowalla Road Bridge and Mimegarra Road have finally been upgraded. Works involved pavement reconstruction, widening to 8m, sealing, posts and signage, and white line marking.

The project was managed by the Shire and took approximately four months to complete. Most of the road reconstruction was undertaken by the Shire's Operations crew, with contractors providing traffic control, pulverisation and stabilisation, cartage, sealing and line marking services.



When: Thursday 2 June 2022, 10.30am - 3.30pm

Where: Lancelin Community Hall, 63 Miragliotta St, Lancelin WA 6044

Walk in or book online rollup.wa.gov.au

What: Lancelin clinic is providing Pfizer vaccine only.

Who: From ages 5 years +

For all immunisation stages eg,1st, 2nd, 3rd booster and Winter 4th booster (Special conditions apply for the 4th immunisation booster, see below).

Please note - Winter 4th booster is only for specified populations who are at increased risk of severe disease.

These groups are:

- Adults aged 65 years and older.
- Residents of aged care or disability care facilities (including those under 65 years).
- People aged 16 years and older with severe immunocompromise as defined in the ATAGI statement on use of a 3rd primary dose of COVID-19 vaccine in individuals who are severely immunocompromised.
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander adults aged 50 years and
