The Hon Martin Aldridge, Shire staff, three student Councillors from Gingin District High School and several Shire Councillors involved in the project together with the Gingin Outdoor Activity Space Project group (formerly Gingin Interactive Space Group) and their children took the opportunity to inspect the new space on Friday afternoon, 14 May (pictured above).

The project has been a community driven initiative and is sure to be a terrific asset to all sectors of the Shire's communities in the years to come. An official opening launch for the Outdoor Activity Space will take place during the Gingin 150th Event scheduled to take place on Saturday, 9 October 2021.

## Edward Island Point Track Seasonal Closure

In October 2020 Council resolved to allow seasonal (September to late April) 4x4 vehicle access to the beach directly from the start of the existing Edward Island Point Track (just south of the gates at the south end of Grace Darling Park) as conditions allow.

The closure of the track is now in place and will be removed in September, conditions permitting.

This seasonal closure is for the purpose of recreating dunes, re-establishing vegetation and increasing natural protection for both the Lancelin Caravan Park and the Lancelin town site.

# **Construction of Gingin Emergency Services Centre Underway**

Members of the public may have taken note of the recent clearing of a block of land to the south of the Chittering Gingin St John Ambulance Centre on Weld Street in Gingin.

This location is to be the site for the construction of the new Gingin Emergency Services Centre (GESC). Construction is expected to be completed by approximately April 2022 and when completed, this facility will be utilised by Gingin Volunteer Fire & Rescue and Gingin South Bushfire Brigade.

Additionally, the facility will also act as an Incident Control Centre during emergency level bush fires, of which the Shire has seen 3 in the past 18 months including the Red Gully Bush Fire, Yanchep Bush Fire and more recently, the Gingin Town Site Bush Fire. This facility will act in this capacity as an Incident Control Centre not only for the Shire of Gingin but also for surrounding Shires as it will be a regional facility for the Department of Fire & Emergency Services (DFES) and other relevant emergency services in the event of an emergency level fire threat.

The GESC will be a huge asset to both the Shire and surrounding regions. It will be managed by the Shire of Gingin and has been funded through the DFES Emergency Services Levy.
